- **WHY NEED TO COLLABORATE ?**

- a. Realization that no single entity, including the government, is capable to perform what is required.
- b. Willingness by concerned sectors with the needed capabilities to help.
- c. Openness to cooperate

- COMMON AND UNIFIED PURPOSE ...

- a) A unified purpose must be determined and agreed by all.
- b) Military way of stating the mission (suggested format to define the purpose)
- c) Task and Purpose – To conduct a “whole of society” disaster risk reduction and management operations in order to **alleviate sufferings and prevent the unnecessary loss of life** in relation to the expected earthquake in Metro Manila and other affected areas.

- COMMON AND UNIFIED PURPOSE ...

d. Conditions that will describe that the end-state has been achieved (this will determine the specific tasks).

i. Alleviated sufferings:

1. Affected population was given appropriate temporary shelter.

2. Women and children were given special protection.

ii. Prevented the unnecessary loss of life:

1. Those with life-threatening injuries were given medical care.

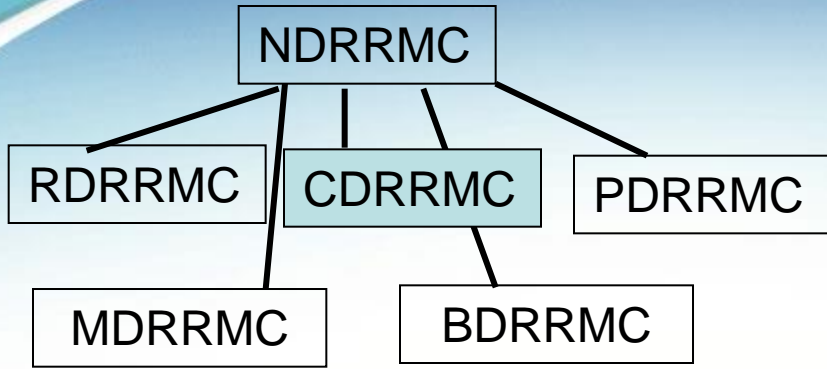
2. Trapped victims were rescued.

iii. (Note: this should not be limited to the response phase)

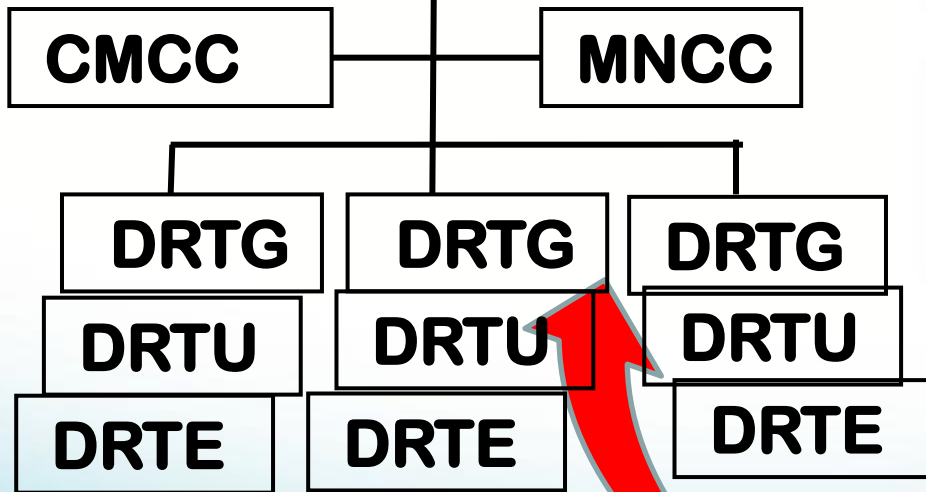
- **SPECIFIC TASKS**

- b. Capabilities required to perform the specific tasks
(develop capabilities if not existing)
- c. Identification of entity which has the capability
required (willing to develop the capability)
- d. Commitment

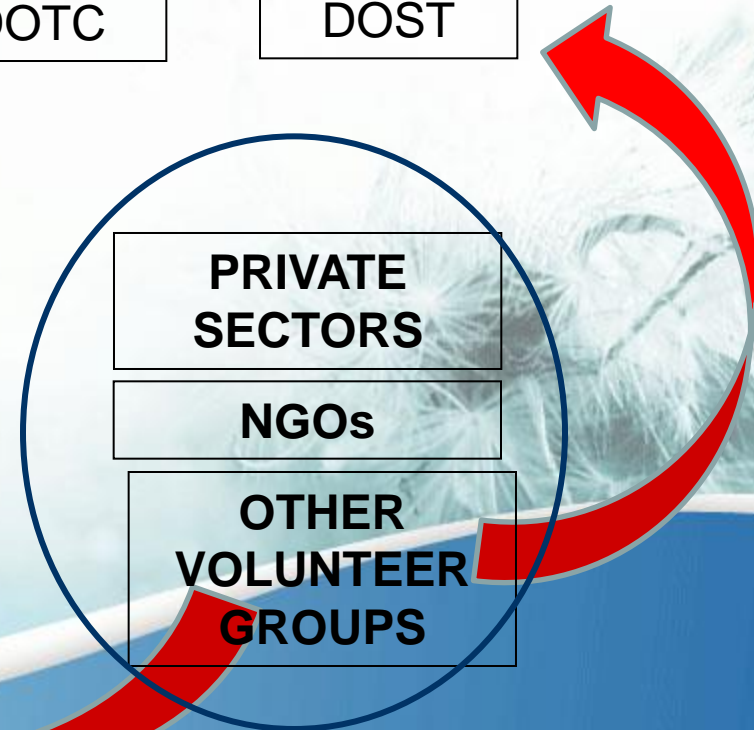
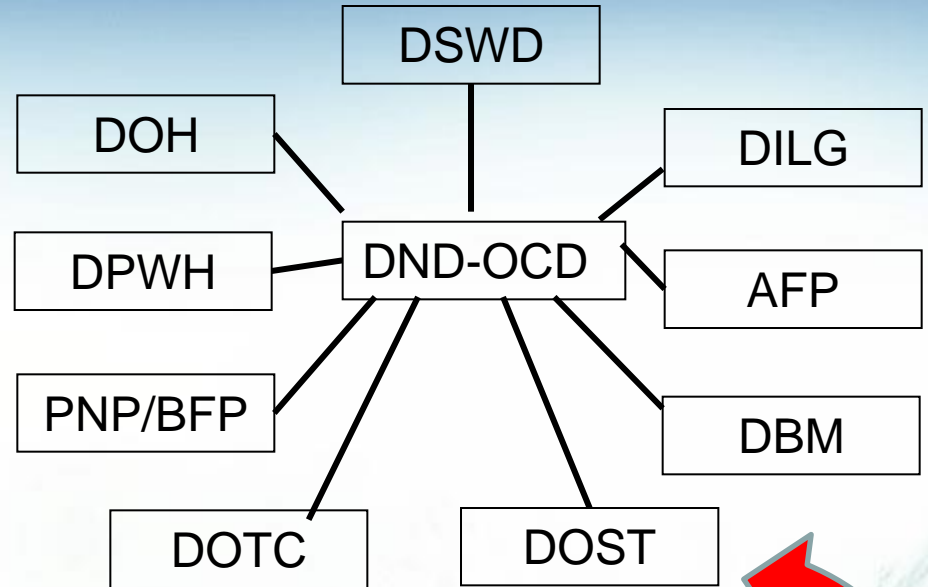

- PLANNING AND DECISION MAKING PROCEDURES

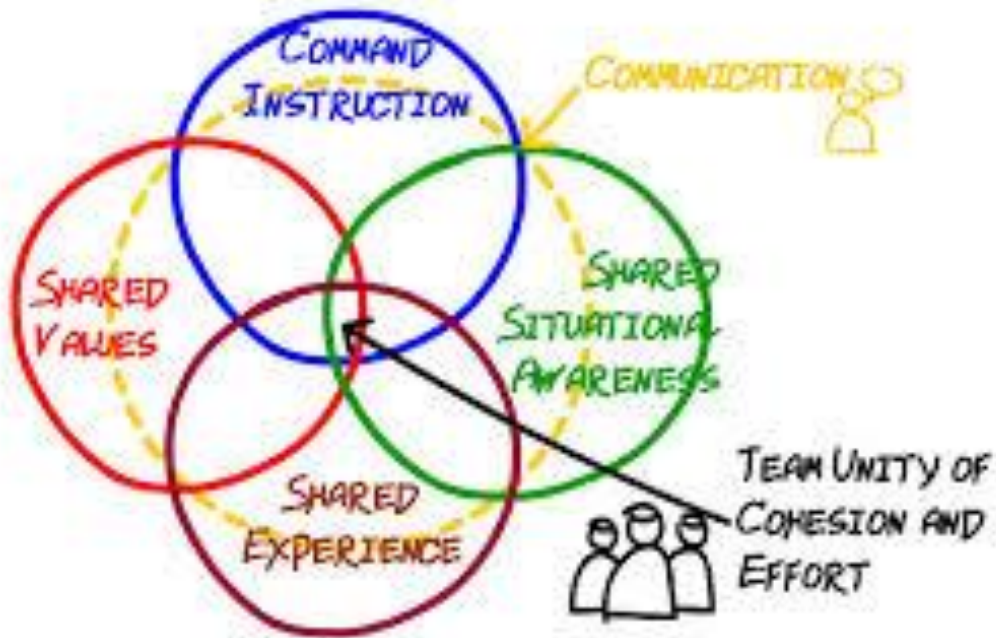
- COLLABORATION MECHANISM

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CHALLENGES IN MULTI-STAKEHOLDER COLLABORATION

- Lack of shared information across agencies
- Lack of personnel
- Piecemeal approach to providing services
- Inadequate collaborative mechanisms.
- Indifference
- Ineffectual inter-agency agreements
- Inefficient and ineffective management practices for establishing interagency teams
- Lack of unity of purpose and effort.
- Differing structure, policies, planning procedures
